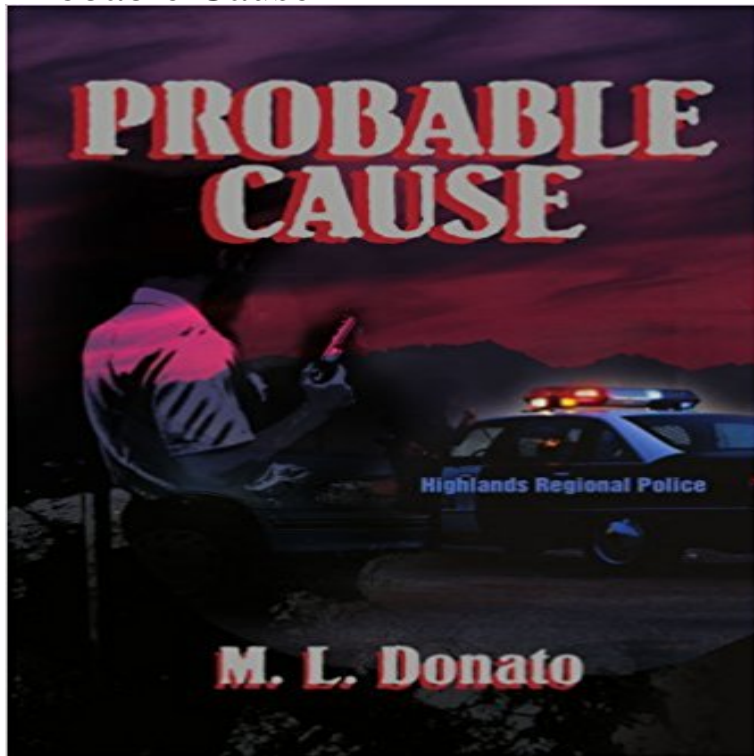


Probable Cause
